#### REPORT ON THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of **UNIVERSAL ARTS LIMITED** (Formerly known as Goldmine Media Limited) ("the Company") and its subsidiary **BAMA INFOTECH PRIVATE LIMITED** ("Subsidiary Company")(collectively referred to as "the Company" or "the Group"), which comprise the consolidated balance sheet as at March 31st, 2018, and the consolidated statement of Profit and Loss and the consolidated Cash Flow for the year then endedand a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as the consolidated financial statements).
